From Capitol Hill to summer camp, NPF remained committed to advancing research, expanding education, and strengthening support for patients and caregivers across the country.

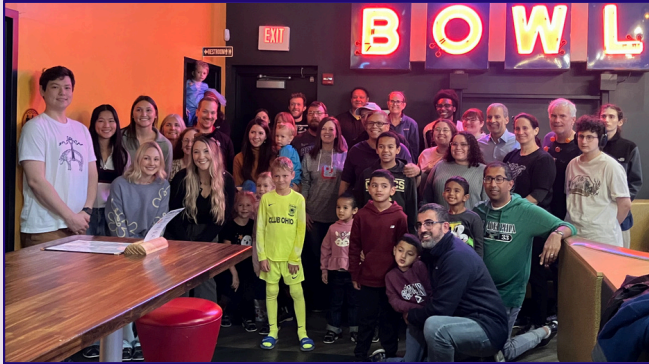
Education & Clinical Leadership

Program	Details
Medical Professionals Portal	19 live and recorded educational webinars were delivered, expanding access to expert-led learning for clinicians nationwide while strengthening collaboration with NPF Centers of Excellence.
Pancreas 101 CME Program	Pancreas 101 remains one of NPF's most impactful professional education initiatives. Program Impact (April 2024–Dec 2025): • 2,679 module completions • 1,379 credits claimed for the pancreatic cancer module • 182 credits claimed for the Familial Chylomicronemia Syndrome module
Fellows Symposium	The 19th Annual Fellows Symposium was held in Orlando, welcoming nearly 100 physicians , including fellows, faculty, and mentors, for collaboration, mentorship, and education.
Advanced Practice Provider Program	NPF launched its Advanced Practice Provider (APP) Committee, bringing together clinical leaders from hospitals nationwide. The program supports APPs through interactive “Lunch & Learn” webinars, a short-form video series, and the upcoming launch of a quarterly APP newsletter in 2026.

Volunteer Leadership	Across the country, the mission continues to be powered by dedicated Chapter Leaders, volunteers, and community supporters, with 27 chapters nationwide and more than 500 participants engaged in community events.
Pilot for Providers & Patients Educational Events	The first in-person patient education event since 2020 brought together more than 60 patients and caregivers in Chicago, concluding with a live Q&A and strong interest in future opportunities to connect and learn.
